

# Obtaining and Sustaining Rental Housing

*A three-webinar series • April 12, 14 & 16, 2021*



Join us for an exciting three-session workshop which will review basic rental counseling practices and how to adapt these basic counseling steps to address rental challenges during the COVID-19 crisis. The workshop will:

- Explore the common national affordable rental programs used by federal and state agencies
- Examine basic concepts and eligibility criteria used in affordable rental housing programs
- Examine legal issues involving landlord and tenant lease agreements
- Review the usual steps in an eviction process using a generic national eviction model and provide tools housing counselors can use with clients to help navigate these eviction challenges
- Investigate solutions relevant to the current COVID-19 eviction crisis
- Evaluate the CARES Act Eviction Moratorium, CDC Temporary Eviction Moratorium, and Rental Assistance Program and extended Eviction Moratorium
